Project Management: Career Track for the future

We live to-day in an uncertain world with rapid changes. The work environment especially in the IT sector where most of us are employed today has become extremely volatile and the uncertainty of layoffs looms over us, as a constant. We constantly hear how tools like ChatGPT are out to make sure that IT and Programming skills are no longer needed. In this background it is indeed heartening to learn from Pierre Le Manh, President & CEO, PMI), that CAPM and PMP ranked #1 and #2 of all professional certifications!!

"Whoa!" I hear you say ..nothing to worry about ..but then again, a niggling doubt.

So, what is it about the new technologies especially AI that you need to be prepared for. First while it is true that many mundane jobs will be replaced by technology, many more jobs will be created at a higher skill level. This is where Project managers will have the biggest edge. Any technology before adoption into mainstream must of course go through a planned and time bound development process. Project Managers will play a significant role, decision making is still left a lot to human intelligence.

So how do we stay on track and ensure a career path for the future? Having come from a technology background most of us have been focused on improving our technical skills through learning more languages, technologies. But as AI takes away more of these, to quote from a speaker at a recent seminar "The hottest programming language of the future is likely to be **English**, not Python!" Yes, the programming is likely to be taken away with advent of new interfaces, but the work will still need to be accomplished! It will still be a human who will Plan, execute, Control and Monitor the activities needed to achieve the expected outcome – as laid out in the Project Charter. It will still be a human being who will enumerate and review Risks to be managed.

It gives me a throwback to my years in the nascent IT industry ,of the Early Eighties of the last Century. Those days we would write programs in COBOL running to hundreds of pages and have to compile them overnight on mainframe computer which took up half a floor! With advances in technology many said programmers would be redundant ... but instead we find that IT industry is booming, as it takes a human being to even interpret a requirement into how it needs to be achieved. True the nature of the job has changed, from telling the client that things can be done only in a particular way, to collaboratively working with them in an Agile environment to achieve the most beneficial outcome.

So does that make us feel smug and satisfied, we do have the PMP certification after all. But can we sit on our laurels? No, certification is just the beginning of the process. Project Management is an actively evolving field and AI will definitely be used in the near future in the to improve the success rate of Projects, a matter of concern the world over and something that we all have encountered in our professional lives.

A Standish Group report states that only 35% of projects worldwide with investment of over 48 trillion USD has been successful. What a colossal waste! In the future it is likely that AI tools and big data will be used extensively to help a PM to improve the rate of success. Some of the areas that these tools will be deployed in are likely to be

- Selection and Prioritization of Projects
- PMO Support, like selection of PM methodology, monitoring of Projects etc.
- Faster Project Definition, Planning, Reporting
- Virtual Project Assistants, that can learn from past projects and provide prompts on resources

So, what then is likely to be the job of the Project Manager? You will notice that these AI tools remove the repetitive and mainly automate the routine functions in a quicker manner. And prompts the Project Manager with suggested courses of action, which could help remove some bias and subjective decision making.

The skills that the PM must retain and develop and hone to the best are now what is termed the Soft Skills. Projects will continue to deal with people, Stakeholders like Project teams, customer, end users, even the public at large as in many projects of today which could impact the environment.

Below I would like to list out a set of effective Skills that any PM must acquire in the future :

Emotional Maturity

- ✓ Every PM needs to withstand the shocks and strains, we must cultivate a calm approach to situations
- ✓ Leading a team does not mean that the PM must be the best !!
- Project is not a competition within team members or an examination

Empathy

- ✓ Empathy is NOT Sympathy; it is putting yourself in the other person's shoes
- ✓ Often, a little understanding and sharing the problems of a team member is critical !!
- ✓ No form of AI can possibly replace that personal touch, of a pat in the back or a calming stroke.

Effective Communication

- ✓ The right message delivered at the right time in the right manner is the key to success
- ✓ Must be Clear and Concise, for both Verbal and Non-verbal
- ✓ Ensure that you have been understood thru Feedback!

Honesty

- ✓ TRUTH is important... don't tell a lie
- ✓ Customer and team must both TRUST you
- ✓ Bring problems into focus and resolve them

Learning Ability

- Learning is a lifelong journey ... Customer needs, Business needs, stakeholder expectations etc.
- \checkmark Be open to new ideas , the ability to unlearn and relearn is essential
- ✓ Adopt and adapt tried & tested techniques, best practices
- ✓ Keep up-to-date with new developments
- ✓ Ensure that your skills and certifications are current, including renewal for your PMP

Leadership

- ✓ Leadership is a skill not talent -- Leaders are not born they are made!
- ✓ Instill confidence in team members , be there when they need you
- ✓ In times of crisis take responsibility, even if it not your fault, you can always analyse the root cause and take preventive action later
- ✓ Prioritize the issues and find solutions , collaboratively

Resilience

- ✓ "Who moved my Cheese ?"-- don't react .. be prepared to find Cheese in a different place
- Adaptability is key to survival -- Change based on circumstances
- ✓ Plan, Assess and prepare for risks

So, while these may not be a hard and fast guide for the future, I am sure that these pointers if practiced will provide a smooth journey for you in your chosen career path of a Project management Professional where you can use AI as a tool to support your deliverables and ensure a better success rate on your projects.

The movie imagined how technological advancements might disrupt the life of the simple humble humans. An ironical take on the technological transformation played by Chaplin most brilliantly in probably one of his last non dialogue movies. I first saw the movie while in school and remember, once took heavy reference from it while writing an essay on one of the most beloved topics of school life, 'Is technology, a boon or a bane?' That essay became by inspiration for this article today.

Come 2023 and the digital world has started to transform in leaps and bounds with the blessings of Generative Artificial Intelligence. Early last year I got myself enlightened with the concepts of Citizen Developer (CD) and low-code/ no-code (LCNC) through the PMI website. And here I am, trying my hands on a more advanced topic – Generative AI. The boon or bane debate has again cropped up and this time beyond the schoolbooks to the levels of CXOs & policy makers. The OpenAI CEO Sam Altman, the brain behind ChatGPT, himself met the US President recently to request for a regulatory framework on AI. PMI's CAPM Exam Content Outline (ECO) now comprises 4 domains viz. Project Management Fundamentals and Core concepts, Predictive, Plan driven methodologies, Agile Framework methodologies and Business Analysis Frameworks.

This approach empowers newcomers to project management, regardless of prior experience, to refine skills in predictive and adaptive methods. It covers Agile practices and cultivates a deep understanding of the business context, all aimed at delivering stakeholder value.

After finishing the training, participants will obtain a 23 contact hours certificate from the chapter. These hours have no expiration date, allowing participants to pursue the CAPM certification when deemed valuable for their work. Meanwhile, they can apply the acquired knowledge to enhance their daily tasks.

The participants shared the takeaways that they had from the training and as per the participants' feedback, the CAPM training had an overall rating of 4.70 on a scale of 5. With the encouraging feedback received from the participants and the learnings that all of us had in successfully piloting the training program in Region 11 of PMI South Asia, the Chapter plans to launch another CAPM training program in early Q2 FY23."

Like any other organisation, Project Management skills are important for them to deliver value for their beneficiaries and manage Sponsor's expectations.


